SCIENCE studies the operation of natural forces, occultism studies their origins. Science studies effects, occultsm seeks causes.

The sight is different from the eye, the hearing from the ear. But thought itself is only a more complex sensation shan sight or hearing, etc. It is the synthesis of all these and something more. Now as it is not the eye that sees, but the power of sight, so it is not the brain that thinks, but the power of thought behind the brain, or conscious-As this power is developed (and in some it is so weak as to be unable to recognize itself), it will rise to the cognition of higher states of consciousness than is possible to the average man. is this consciousness which passes from one body to another in reincarnation. When it leaves the body the body is "dead," though various physical operations may still be carried on in it.

If you wish to destroy Karmic effects, destroy the fixed consciousness of "yourself." Live in the universal life and you will inherit the universal Karma. This is "good," for the Karma of the manifestation is to return to the manifestor.—Jasper Niemand.

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
