

should, on the material then before him and on their statement of the facts, make an order for the maintenance of Mary Hogan, who was living with and cared for by her sister, Annie Nolan, and Annie's husband, William Nolan, Mary's committee. In the present circumstances, \$250 a year was a fair and reasonable sum to allow for her maintenance, support, care, and attention; and that sum should be paid accordingly from the 1st January, 1920, until further order.—Costs of all parties of the application (including the application for maintenance) should be paid as follows: two-thirds thereof out of the estate of Michael Hogan, and one-third out of the moneys of Mary Hogan. S. M. Clark, for the applicant and the purchaser. Metcalfe, for William Nolan, committee of Mary Hogan. Gleeson, for John Hogan the younger.
