With leave of the Senate-

The Honourable Senator Aseltine moved, seconded by the Honourable Senator Beaubien—

That the name of the Honourable Senator Robertson, P.C., be substituted for that of the Honourable Senator Hodges on the list of Senators serving on the Standing Committee on Transport and Communications.
