RESOLUTION 5.

A Resolution for the relief of Paula Elaine Segal Kurland.

[Adopted 17th March, 1964.]

Whereas Paula Elaine Segal Kurland, residing at the city of Cote St-Luc, in the province of Quebec, wife of Leonard Kurland, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the said city, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the twelfth day of January, A.D. 1957, at the city of New York, in the state of New York, one of the United States of America, she then being Paula Elaine Segal; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, on the ground of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore the Senate of Canada, pursuant to the provisions of the Dissolution Annulment of Marriages Act and subject to section 2 thereof, resolves as follows:—

1. On the expiration of thirty days from the date of the adoption by the Senate of this resolution, the said marriage shall be dissolved and thenceforth shall be null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.
