C.N.R. STEVEDORE PAYROLL, NORTH SYDNEY,
N.S.Question No. 235—**Mr. Muir (Cape Breton-The Sydneys):**

What was the annual payroll of Canadian National Railways at North Sydney, Nova Scotia, for stevedores and other employees at the Terminal Wharf in each of the years from 1960 to the present?

Hon. Paul Hellyer (Minister of Transport):

The management of Canadian National Railways advises as follows: Information for the years 1960 to 1964 is not readily available as the payroll register has been destroyed and to extract the figures from other sources would involve considerable time and expense. In addition, prior to 1967 employees at the terminal wharves of North Sydney and Mulgrave were paid on the same payroll. The following figures for the years indicated include employees at both North Sydney and Mulgrave: 1965, \$3,955,113; 1966, \$4,393,239; 1967, \$4,878,353.

IMPORTS OF CORN

Question No. 237—**Mr. Danforth:**

1. What major companies or firms in Canada have imported corn into Canada in 1966, 1967 and 1968 to date?
2. What was the total amount imported?

3. Which elevators or storage facilities in Ontario and Quebec were used to store imported corn in 1966, 1967 and 1968 to date?

4. What was the total amount of imported corn stored in each of these facilities for the years 1966, 1967 and 1968 to date?

Mr. Yves Forest (Parliamentary Secretary to President of the Privy Council): I am informed by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics and the Department of Agriculture as follows: 1. The Dominion Bureau of Statistics does not maintain a list of names and addresses of companies or firms importing goods into Canada.

2. The total amount of corn imported into Canada in the following years was:

Ltd., Goderich; Hiram Walker Sons Grain Corp., Walkerville; Maple Leaf Mills Ltd., Toronto; Canada Steamship Lines Ltd., Kingston; National Harbours Board, Prescott; National Harbours Board, Montreal; Fédérée Elevators Ltd., Montreal; Three Rivers Elevators Ltd., Trois-Rivières; National Harbours Board, Québec; Cargill Grain Co. Ltd., Baie Comeau; Bungé of Canada Ltd., Québec; National Harbours Board, Port Colborne; Upper Lake Shipping Ltd., Goderich; Louis Dreyfus Canada Ltd., Port Cartier.

4. The Board of Grain Commissioners advise that the amounts and types of the different grains stored in privately operated elevators are reported to them on a confidential basis. On a regional basis, quantities of imported corn stored in public elevators for the domestic market and in bond for export, are as follows:
