That in view of the extreme concern of farmers in Leeds and Grenville counties resulting from the outbreak of brucellosis among cattle in the area, this House requests the government to enunciate a clear policy on the matter of whether or not to vaccinate cattle against this disease in place of the present so-called de-emphasizing program, and also this House requests the government to bring compensation payments for cattle necessarily destroyed because of brucellosis more in line with current market values.
