Dear Mr. Macneil:-

I am enclosing herewith a copy of the statement of the Poppy Day Account with the Bank of Montreal.

You will note that no returns have been received from Alberta, from Manitoba, or from Quebec. Apparently there are still outstanding funds to come from British Columbia and Ontario. I have had to call the attention of the Treasurers in British Columbia and Nova Scotia to small discrepancies in their reports. In Mr. Hamilton's final statement he took credit for \$64.50 forwarded from Dartmouth through the Bank of Montreal. The Bank say that this amount was never received by them. Mr. Walter Drinnan's account takes credit for \$16.00 forwarded from Clinton, B.C., which amount has never been received by the Bank.

I would like instructions from you as to what I shall do with this amount of \$47,991.06. Shall it remain untouched until all the accounts are in or is it to be disposed of at once? The French Consul of Montreal spoke to me yesterday concerning this fund. Apparently some one in France is looking for it. I regret very much that it has taken so long to have it cleaned up. I would be obliged to receive your instructions as soon as possible.
