The SHEPHERD of BANBURY's Rules to judge of the Changes of the Weather, If the Sun rife red and fiery, - wind and rain. If cloudy, and it from decrease, - certain fair weather. C L O U D S. Small and round, like a dapple-grey, with a north wind,fair weather for two or three days. Large like rocks, - greas frewers. If small Clouds encrease, - much rains If large Clouds decrease, - fair weather. MISTS. If they rife in low grounds, and foon vanish, - fair weather. If they rise to the hill tops, — rais is a day or two. A general Mix before the Sun rifes, near the full Moon,fair weather. If in the new Moon, - rain in the old. If in the old,—rain is the new.

WINDS. 1. Observe, that in eight years time there is as much south-west wind, as north-east; and confequently as many wet years, as dry. 2. When the Wind turns to north-east, and it continues two days without rain, and does not turn fouth on the third day, it is likely to continue north-east for eight of nine days, -- all fair; and then

3. If it turns again out of the fouth to the north-east with rain and continues in the north-east two days without rais, and neither turns fouth, nor rains the third day, it is like to consinue north-east for swo or three manks.—The Wind will finish theseturns in three weeks.

SOUTH - WEST WINDS.

T. After a northerly Wind, for the most part two months or more, and then coming fouth, there are usually three or four fair days at first, and then on the fourth or fifth day comes rain, or else the wind

turns north again, and continues dry.

come to the fouth again.

2. If it returns to the fouth within a day or two without rain, and northward with rain, and returns to the fouth in one or two days. as before, two or three times together after this fort,—then it is like to be in the fouth or fouthwest two or three months together, as it was in the north before—The Winds will snish these turns in a fortnight.

3. Fair weather for a week with a fouthern Wind, is like to produce a great draught, If there has been much rain out of the fouth before. The Wind aftuilly turns from north to fouth with a quiet wind without rain, but returns to the north with a firong winds and rain; The fronges Winds are when it turns from fouth to morth by west.

N. B. When the north Wind first clears the air, (which is usually once a week) be sure of a fair day or two.

r. In Summer or Harvest, when the wind has been fouth two or three days, and it grows very hot, and you fee Clouds, rife with
