THE CONGRESS OF COLOMBIA,

Nominating certain Ports of Entry, for the Warehousing and Bonding of Goods.

Bogota, April 3, 1826.

THE Senate and Chamber of Representatives have considered that the establishment of free Ports for the warehousing and bonding of goods will be attended with considerable advantage, as well to the Importer, who obtains the facility of re-exporting, free of duty, those goods which he cannot without difficulty dispose of, and to the people in general, who are thus provided with a ready and plentiful supply of various articles of consumption, have decreed, and do decree as follows:—

DECREE.

- Art. 1. The Ports of Puerto Cabello and Cartagena on the Atlantic, and of Guayaquil on the Pacific, shall be free Ports of entry for bonding goods and effects of every description and sort whatever.
- Art. 2. All goods and merchandise thus imported, shall, on arrival, be deposited in the storehouses of the Customs, and remain there till reclaimed, the whole or part of them, by the importer or consignee, for sale or re-exportation.
