### SECRET CONFERENCE FINDS OPPOSITION

#### The New Terms Of Armistice

Retribution For Frightfulness and Return of Stolen Goods Among Important Demands Made By

London, Jan. 15.—The new armistice terms to be presented to Germany by Marshal Foch are unofficially stated here to include the following: First—Retribution upon the Germans for the murder and ill-treatment of allied prisoners.

Second—The machinery and goods stolen by Germany from France and Belgium to be at once given up. It is pointed out that France alone has 500,000 men who will be out of work until this machinery is returned.

Third—German gold, amounting to more than £100,000,000, to be moved from Berlin to a safe place, probably Frankfort, and protected from Bolshevism in Germany en route. Certain other property to be surrendered. Fourth—Germany to give over her shipping, of which she is believed to have four million tons, to carry food supplies to countries in Europe in need of them.

Fifth—Any U-boats on the stocks to be handed to the allies for their disposal, or to be destroyed, and no more submarines should be built.
