ANOTHER CLOUDBURST. A TRIPLE MURDER.

It was Accompanied by Loss of Life-Damage at Roundville \$500,000-Railway Bridges Wrecked.

Dellaware, Ohio, July 6.—A cloudburst occurred early in the morning in this section, doing great damage to property. Sheep, horses and cattle were drowned; tractors and bridges and several houses, with contents, and the large canning and preserving works of McMillan Bros. were swept away by the high water flowing over the bridges.

Wheeling, W. Va., July 6.—The storm which passed over this vicinity last night was particularly severe. Two Baltimore & Ohio Railway bridges across Wheeling Creek at this place were badly damaged.

A strange discovery of a treasure box was made in the excavation of the Waterloo Memorial in Princeton, Ont.
