SATURDAY'S WHEAT MARKETS

Speculative Options Still Remain Dull.

Cabled Situation at Liverpool, London and Paris—Chicago and Other American Boards—Local Grain, Fruit and Produce Markets—Quotations, Notes and General Gossip.

Saturday Evening, Aug. 8.

Amongst the wheat news of the past few days has been the significant advance of 11c per bushel at Buda Pesth. That market takes the most of its supplies from Russia, and this appreciation in value is taken as confirmation of the previous report of crop failures in several districts of the Czar's European empire. These developments and the unusual demand for wheat in Germany are considered as encouraging by the advocates of higher prices. On the other hand, the bears are relying upon the extraordinary gains nearly all countries have gained their grain during the past few months. Reliable authorities believe that the European and American harvests will more than suffice for all requirements after reaping the world's depleted reserves, and this without calling upon Argentina, Australia and other countries whose crops are in during the winter. The whole majority of authorities claim that the bears have been out of the Chicago market.

Bradstreet's statement of the world's wheat stocks on Oct. 1 shows an increase for September in Canada and the United States of 10,225,000 bushels, or an increase abroad of 5,400,000 bushels, or an increase in Europe and America of only 15,000,000 bushels for September, or an increase of 27,000,000 bushels in September, 1893. The Canadian, United States and European stocks are 84,000,000 bushels, the United States and Canadian stocks are the smallest since 1882.

Bradstreet makes exports from both coasts for the past week, 5,307,224 bushels, against 5,306,870 bushels last week. Corn exports 3,994,000 bushels, against 3,530,000 bushels.

Total wheat and flour clearances from New York during the week ending Sept. 29, 1893, are 62,250,412 bushels in the same period a year ago.

Cable received this morning about the Roumanian wheat situation reads: Three and a half millions being loaded at the Upper Danube, and the rest of the harvest retarded by late water. Roumania wheat export the same as last year. Hungary is a large buyer in Roumania.

The Kansas Agricultural Bureau says that the want of rain in that State has left the ground too hard to plant.

Total clearances to-day: Wheat and flour, 185,000 bushels; corn, 214,400 bushels. Receipts of wheat at Minneapolis and Duluth today, 1112 cars, against 1144 the same day a year ago.

St. Louis wheat receipts to-day, 97,122 bushels, against 62,215 bushels a year ago. December wheat puts at Chicago, 62 1/2c; rails, 63 1/2c. Corn puts, 29 1/2c; calls, 29 1/2c. Liverpool wheat futures eased off 3/4d per cental to-day.

Canadian Flour Trade.

The Montreal Trade Bulletin says: The receipts of flour were heavy, 7,740 tons, but quiet and quite a lot of it was shipped to Newfoundland and British ports, but the greater portion consisted of American brands. We learn that freight has been cut down for about 100,000 barrels of American flour from this port for the purpose of American receipts, besides what has been taken for Newfoundland. A lot of flour was shipped from here to Newfoundland this week which was sold for about 100,000 barrels, but the sale was made some time ago by a Western mill, and was therefore not new business. Our advices from Liverpool by last mail report large receipts of American flour and some Canadian. The sale was reported of a round lot of Canadian winter patents at 26s 3d, but since then sales have been reported by cable at 26s 3d to 26s per sack of 260 lbs. for the same brand of flour belonging to a Western mill. Canadian spring patents have sold in Liverpool at 28s, but this week cables were received reporting sales at 28s 6d. It would, therefore, seem that the Americans have not got all the market to themselves on the other side, and, as farmers are beginning to offer their wheat more freely in the West, a good trade may yet be done in Ontario flour for export account.

Barley—Quoted at 41c to 42c, middle grades, for No. 1.

Brain—Sells at \$8 to \$8.50 west and shorts at \$12.50 to \$13.50 west.

Corn—American, 58c, at Toronto, on track.

Peas—New peas are quoted at 51c north and west, in car lots.

Outmeal—Car lots of rolled oats, in bags, on track at Toronto, \$3.25 a barrel, \$3.65.
