FINDS A SUPERFICIAL SENTIMENT STRONG FOR BRITISH CONNECTION

Correspondent of Minneapolis Paper Discusses Canada's "Manifest Destiny" in the Light of Recent Events—Appreciation of Prof. Goldwin Smith's Views.

Minneapolis, Dec. 20.—The Journal's staff correspondent in Toronto says: Throughout its investigations in this city of the attitude of the leading Canadian statesmen to reciprocity with the United States, I have been struck by the prevalence of the opinions that would be voted here. Toronto is supposed to be the seat of a very strong pro-British feeling and the headquarters of all movements tending towards the establishment of closer relations between Great Britain and Canada and more distant relations between the United States and Canada. Superficially, at least, the people here, or, any way, their prominent men, are strongly British in sentiment.

SMUGGLERS ARRESTED. Prominent Men at San Juan, Puerto Rico, Locked Up.

San Juan de Puerto Rico, Dec. 20.—Superintendent of Elections Benjamin Bulwer, Captain G. H. H. U.S.M.C., and James Brennan, an employee of the Country Club, have been arrested, on information received by customs authorities, for smuggling two lots of wines and liquors from St. Thomas, brought here on the United States steamer Unesa, and light-house tender Laurel, in all 64 cases. The prisoners were bound over until Monday and Tuesday, under \$2000 bail, when the preliminary hearing will be held before United States Commissioner Anderson. Bulwer is managing officer of the club, and Brennan is the steward. The arrest of another prominent party will be made to-day, and it is said that a large number more will follow, as the smuggling has continued for a long period, and goods are being sent to San Juan in this way.
