The principal and constant sources of our revenue must be, Weekly Contributions, Ordinary Collections, Missionary Collections, Thanksgiving Offerings, and the Ladies' Association. From these sources, united, should come supplies sufficient to meet all the necessary financial needs of the Congregation, and any incidental revenue from other temporary sources cannot be rightly taken into account in estimating our available income. From this comparative statement of the receipts for 1886 and for 1887, and from the items of expenditure for 1887, the following conclusions, which we earnestly commend to your serious consideration, seem to be fairly deducible:—

1. It will be seen by an examination of the figures given above that from Weekly Contributions, Ordinary Collections, Thanksgiving Offerings, Prayer Meeting Collections, Missionary Collections and Ladies' Association—that is from the ordinary sources of our revenue—our income for 1887 fell short of that of 1886 by the somewhat large amount of \$683.13. If our income from these sources had been kept up even to the standard of 1886, we should have been able to meet all

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
