RUSSIA FIRMLY TELLS CHINA TO OUST SEMENOFF

Note, Though Couched in Friendly Terms, Virtually an Ultimatum.

MOSCOW, Sunday, May 26.—(By the Associated Press.)—Foreign Minister Tchitcherine has sent another protest to China, charging the Chinese Government with officially protecting General Semenov, the anti-Bolshevik leader in Siberia, in his activities against the soviet power. The note requests that China either prevent General Semenov from using Manchuria as a base for his operations, or to permit soviet troops to cross into the Chinese territory and quell General Semenov. If China considers herself too weak to do so, the foreign minister's communication states, has determined once and for all to end the unendurable situation on the Manchurian border. Friendliness to China, however, is expressed in the note, which states that Russia "makes this urgent friendly request."

SWEDEN AND ALLIES EFFECT AGREEMENT

LONDON, May 30.—The Swedish minister announced today that a commercial and navigation agreement between Sweden and Great Britain and her allies was signed yesterday.

WOMEN ARE ROBBED OF THEIR VIRTUE IN SOVIET OF SARATOV

New Decree Makes Them Common Property.

ALL SUPPORTED BY STATE

Only Mothers of Five or More Children Are Exempt.

San Francisco, May 29.—Russian women are no longer their own mistresses in the matter of their relations with men, according to a proposed decree. They are the common property of the men of Russia, and unless a woman is the mother of at least five children she is subject to the beck and call of any man. Even if she is married it makes no difference, for under the new "moral code" adopted by the Russian soviet of Saratov, all marriage ties are declared to be not binding.

This astounding decree, the purpose of which is said to be to repopulate Russia's devastated provinces and which makes family ties illegal and all children the property of the state, is causing the civilized world to gasp. Not even the polygamous "laters" marriages to which the wives of German soldiers are subjected are more revolting to civilization.

Sodom is Outdone. Nothing described in the Old Testament as the cause of the annihilation of cities and peoples is worse than the demands in this startling proclamation set forth by a body of Russian anarchists.

Men and women representing every shade of thought and line of endeavor throughout the United States, have expressed themselves as horror-stricken by the degradation of thought evinced in the decree. Many have declared that the moral women of the world would rise in protest to protect their Russian sisters from such abhorrent practices if they themselves prove helpless.

A copy of the decree was brought to San Francisco by Frank Forest, a British engineer, who obtained it before leaving from Vladivostok. The proclamation, as drawn by the Free Association of Anarchists of Saratov, Russia, sets forth proposals and restrictions that are almost unbelievable.

Remove "Injustices." "The private possession of women is hereby abolished," is the first startling word of the document. The right of man to possess a woman between the ages of 17 and 22 is abolished, the decree declares, and then tells why, in specimens of the fair sex have in the past been limited by marriage to the possession of the bourgeois men, the correct continuation of the human race has been greatly impeded and great injustice and inequalities have resulted.

According to other articles of the proclamation, of which there are fifteen, the former husband shall release his wife from personal ownership, but may call upon her whenever he wishes. All women are exempt from private ownership and are proclaimed to be the property of the whole community, but married women who are the mothers of over five children are not affected by this decree. Any citizen noticing a woman who has not registered under the domination of the Saratov anarchist club is duty bound to report her to headquarters.

"Popular Propagation Fund." Every workingman is required to pay from his earnings 2 per cent in order that a fund, called the "popular propagation fund," be raised. Male citizens not belonging to the workingman's class will be allowed the same privileges as those having by paying 100 rubles per month to the aforesaid fund. All women affected by the decree will receive an allowance of 25 rubles monthly (about \$121), from the propagation fund. All prospective mothers are released from their domestic duties for a period of from three months before to two months after childbirth. All babies one month old are to be given over to an asylum, or popular crib, where they shall be trained and educated until 17 years of age, the expense of their training to be borne by the propagation fund. Every mother shall receive a bonus of 200 rubles.

Both men and women are required to safeguard their health, frequently submitting to medical examinations in laboratories of health. Women in ill-health may apply to the association for a pension. No woman, married or otherwise, shall refuse to respond to the call of any man, no matter what may be his social status, aside from criminality or physical disfigurement, and all men or women who fail to support this decree will be adjudged guilty of sabotage and punished accordingly.

REGISTRAR-GENERAL ASKS FOR LENIENCY FOR DRAFT SUBJECTS

Does Not Want Arrests Made Till He Can Catch Up His Work.

TORONTO, May 30.—Because of the inability of the registrar-general's department at the Parliament Buildings to keep pace with the applications for birth and marriage certificates, it is likely the suggestion will be made to the military authorities in the three districts of Ontario that leniency be shown for a short time in enforcing the latest regulations. Many men who have applied for certificates will be unable to secure them for two or three weeks, and it would be an undoubted hardship if they were arrested in the early days of June before the provincial authorities could catch up with the work.

Removing Children From Paris Owing To Long Range Gun

One Effect of Frightfulness To Gladden the Hun Heart.

PARIS, May 30.—The removal of children from Paris was begun this morning, when 1,000 children from the Mont Mart district of the city were placed on board a special train bound for a vacation colony in the department of Allier, in Central France.

This is the first action taken under a plan for removing Paris children from the possibility of harm from a long-range gun shell striking a school filled with pupils, as a church where worship was in progress was struck on Good Friday last.

The bombardment of Paris by the long-range gun, which was resumed early in the day, was resumed at sunset.

BRITISH PEOPLE WILL NEVER DROP CAUSE

AN ATLANTIC PORT, May 30.—That the British people, even after four years of prodigious effort and heart-breaking losses, are determined to continue the war, "until the menace of the German military power is removed from the world," was the message brought back to the United States by the American labor mission, which arrived here tonight after visiting the capitals and many of the principal cities of England and France.

'NOT WORTH ANSWER,' SAYS PROUDFOOT, OF C. HURON CRITICISM

Says John McMillan Is Peeved — Wants No By-Election.

TORONTO, May 30.—It is not likely there will be any contest in the by-election in Northeast Toronto, Seat A and East York, made necessary by the appointments of the two new ministers.

"Personally, I do not want a contest," said Wm. Proudfoot, leader of the Opposition, "but I will call a meeting of members and get their opinions."

Asked if he wished to reply to the McMillan, defeated candidate in South Centre Huron, Proudfoot seems to have been angry at my support of the Union candidate against him. I never said in my speech that every elector who did not support Union Government was a traitor," said Mr. Proudfoot.

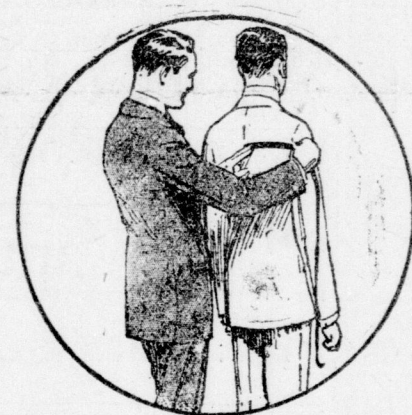
