KING EDWARD AND QUEEN AT MEMORIAL SERVICE

Band of Oxfordshire Light Infantry Played Chopin's Funeral March - Rode Without Escort.

LONDON, Feb. 9.-King Edward and Queen Alexandra, the Prince and Princess of Wales, Princess Victoria and many government officials attended the memorial services to-day at St. Paul's for King Carlos of Portugal and the crown prince. Immense crowds filled the streets along which the king and queen drove, and about the cathedral and within were more than three thousand persons, including the members of the cabinet, members of parliament and the diplomatic corps.

When King Edward and Queen Alexandra entered the cathedral the band of the Oxfordshire Light Infantry, of which King Carlos was honorary colonel, played Chopin's funeral march. During the service it played the dead march in Gael.

Archdeacon Sinclair read the lesson, and the Archbishop of Canterbury pronounced the benediction.

The members of the royal party drove to and from the cathedral in closed carriages, and were not attended by an escort.

DOUMA COOLS DOWN

Have Analyzed Text of Prof. Milukoff's Speech.

ST. PETERSBURG, Feb. 9.-Prof. Paul Milukoff's recent address in New York continues to monopolize attention. Copies of the address and also the New York papers, of Jan. 15 are in great demand. A perusal of the original text, however, has considerably modified the prevalent excitement and several of the Octoberists now declare that the speech is practically without reproach and gives no opportunity for the further hounding of Prof. Milukoff.

Prince Mestchersky, the editor of The Grashnikin, in an article in that paper, rebukes the douma in scathing terms for its action with reference to M. Milukoff, saying: "The schoolboyish demonstration on Feb. 16 is another proof of the lack of brains and the lack of sense in the third douma, which truly does not possess a single sound conservative or Octoberist leader."

One of the principal grievances against M. Milukoff consists in a widespread idea that the brilliant reception which he met with in Washington might serve to counteract the movement in favor of a Russo-American alliance, which is supposed to have begun at the time of Secretary Taft's visit to St. Petersburg. M. Milukoff's appeal to the merits of people for sympathy for his cause also has met with bad temper here.

New Armor Plate. ROME, Feb. 9.-Naval Engineer Baratta has patented a new armor plate. A composition is laid about a foot thick over a single sheet of steel.

The armor thus made is light and cheap, and it is claimed that it has remained unpenetrated by the projectile from the heavy naval gun the Italian admiral is now experimenting with.

DOMINION REVENUE

Figures Show Increase - No Halt in Trade.

OTTAWA, Feb. 9.-The revenue of the Dominion for the month of January was \$7,288,313, as compared with \$6,963,976 in January of last year, an increase of \$324,337. The customs revenue was practically the same in the two Januarys, indicating that there was no serious halt in trade; in fact the receipts for this year's first month were \$84,227 more than in the corresponding month of 1904. Excise shows a decrease of \$37,744, but 43 per cent. increase in the post office receipts of \$94,656; public works, including railways, showed a betterment of \$676,535; and miscellaneous receipts were \$180,329 better than in January, 1904.
