W. W. Snow wires from Larimore, N.D.: The condition of North Dakota wheat is good at least 15 per cent this week. The loss each day will increase rapidly until the state has been overtaken by the last week was scattered showers over small areas, hardly enough to make any impression. Plant everywhere is small from lack of moisture since and before seeding. The yield per acre will be less than last year. The situation is very serious. Some districts are in bad reports, but rains in few days will improve things. General situation is bad, but trade very apprehensive.
