Soccer Clubs in Montreal Will Continue in Spite of the War

MONTREAL, April 11.—The M.A.A. withdrawal from soccer will not in any way affect the machinery of the M.A.A., as the first division vacancy is likely to be filled by Verdun City, who are next on the roster for promotion. But, nevertheless, keen regret is expressed in official circles that the section of the M.A.A. is temporarily disbanded. Yet they look upon it as a domestic decision concerning that association alone.

But soccerism in this district did not all recent aspirations cast upon them for playing instead of enlisting. Hundreds of them have already gone, the M.A.A. membership of clubs alone has fallen from 72 in 1914 to 28 in 1916. Those staying behind have just reasons, and no soccer club in the world could prevent them from going, nor would it claim to accelerate the speed. Dozens of clubs are now in the process of reorganization, notably Simpson of M.A.A. Others have private teams that do not concern the public. The leading officials of the game decline to be stampeded. On the contrary, they will retain under modified conditions the threads and reins of government until their thousands of members return from the war. They invite no superior comparisons of recruiting, resting perfectly content on their record.

CUBAN HORSE BREEDING TO HAVE GOVERNMENT AID

Will Follow the Lead Set in France and England—President Interested.

MONTREAL, April 11.—There was to have been a meeting of the new Province of Quebec Racing Association yesterday afternoon, but, as some of those interested were away, it was postponed till some time this week.

It is understood that, as far as Mount Royal track is concerned, some of the local newspapermen will be probably appointed as judges, while William Murray of Maltonville will in all probability be appointed starter there, and purchase of all the Quebec tracks, if he cares to take the place, it is said, of Mr. Henschi at Mount Royal and assume full executive control.

A gentleman closely connected with Canadian Racing Association interests said today:

"This talk of war is all nonsense. There is no war. If the half-mile tracks of the province and the mile tracks that are not members of the Canadian Racing Associations desire to form a governing body of their own, there is no reason why they should not. From latest advice I have received from headquarters in Toronto, it looks as if the Canadian Racing Associations would leave them severely alone."

"The overlapping of a few dates between Ontario and Province of Quebec tracks is no new thing, and has never done any serious harm."

"But local tracks will realize that it will do no one any good to have races in Montreal on two tracks at the same time, and that any reputable stables and jockeys that race on the half-mile tracks will always be permitted to ride on the tracks of the C.R.A."
