Burning Glasses .- Lences of a large diameter are able to melt metals in a few seconds, on which common fires and even glass house furnaces have produced no effect.—M. Villette, a Frenchman, near ly a century ago, constructed a mirror three feet eleven inches in diameter, and three feet two inches in focal distance, which melted copper ore in eight seconds, iron ore in twenty four seconds, a fish's tooth in thirty two seconds, cast iron in sixteen seconds, a silver sixpence in seven seconds, and tin in three seconds. This mirror condenced the solar rays seventeen thousand two hundred and fifty seven times, a degree of heat which is about four hundred and rinety times greater than common fire.
