ANNUAL MEETING SCHOOL FOR DEAF

Matters in Connection With Institution Talked Over—Book-keeping Discussed.

The annual meeting of the shareholders of the New Brunswick School for the Deaf, Lancaster, was held yesterday afternoon in the warehouses of A. O. Skinner, King street. Those present were G. H. Warwick, who presided; J. Harvey Brown, R. T. Hayes, Mrs. A. McLeod, J. V. Russell and G. Fred Fisher.

Mr. Hayes read the financial statement for the year. This showed receipts of \$6,400, including a small balance from 1907, and expenditures about \$500 in excess of this amount. Mr. Hayes moved that the accounts be referred to the same auditors as last year, and it found correct entered on the minutes. This was agreed to.

Mr. Fisher thought that the auditors, besides inspecting the accounts, ought also to examine the books of the institution. The books, he said, ought to include a cash book and ledger. In the cash book the running expenses ought to be kept under appropriate headings, while the ledger might show interest accounts and bonded debts of the institution.

Mr. Hayes explained that he already has a cash book and ledger. The accounts in the former, he said, are divided up a little more, and he would be glad of any hints that would be useful to him.

The chairman said that in his work for the Protestant Orphan Asylum he keeps a cash book and a ledger. Except in isolated cases he said he never gets an itemized account for maintenance at the end of the month. He merely gets a memorandum of the amount, for which he makes a check and then enters the transaction in the cash book.
