## WEATHER PROVERBS AND OTHER PROVERBS.

1 TUES	O, ye showers and dew, bless ye the Lord : praise him and magnify him forever.
2 WED	O, ye winds of God, bless ye the Lord : praise him and magnify him forever.
3 THU	April showers bring forth May flowers.
4 FRI	<b>Sixth Sunday in Lent.</b>
5 SAT	April borrowed three days from March and they are ill.
6 Sun	A cold April the barn will fill.
7 MON	April and May are the keys of the year.
8 TUES	If mists rise in low ground and soon vanish, expect fair weather.
9 WED	<b>Easter Sunday.</b>
10 THU	If mists rise to the hill-tops, expect rain in a day or two.
11 FRI	Their not rising any higher or passing off in the shape of clouds, shows that there is not sufficient solar heat for the purpose, and they must soon condense into rain.
12 SAT	A black mist indicates coming wet, because the blackness is owing to dense clouds which overshadow it, and such
13 Sun	<b>Low Sunday.</b>
14 MON	clouds will supply the wet.
15 TUES	Sudden rains never last long. But when the air grows thick by degrees, and the sun, moon and stars shine dimmer and dimmer, then it is likely to rain six hours usually.
16 WED	<b>Second Sunday after Easter.</b>
17 THU	SOMETIMES lightning is followed by thunder beginning with a rumbling noise, succeeded by a crashing sound, and this is again followed by a rumbling noise. This is explained as follows : Let A B represent a zig-zag discharge from one cloud to another ; suppose the discharge takes place by the branches A C, in one cloud, and from the other by the branches B D ; then an observer at E would hear the rattling sound resulting from the motion of electricity along the paths A C, then the concentrated discharge through A B
