Waldek Zbyszko, the Polish heavyweight champion, defeated Jim Esson, a husky Scot, in straight falls in Montreal on Friday. Zbyszko showed great cleverness and forced the giant Scotchman to travel at a fast clip. Referee Lapage awarded Zbyszko the first fall on a foul after thirty-four minutes of wrestling, after several desperate attempts to pin Zbyszko, Esson became angry and hit him a stiff punch in the stomach. Zbyszko earned the second fall after twenty-two minutes with an arm lock and body hold. Esson tried roughing it up at times and was hissed by the crowd. The most exciting incident of the evening's programme occurred when Esson stood in the centre of the ring challenging the crowd of fans. They kept throwing apples and orange peels at him and when Esson finally saw one throw something he jumped over the ropes and down into the crowd. Those who had thrown things at the big Scot beat a hasty retreat.

Esson was greatly weakened by the severe punishment that Zbyszko forced upon him. Zbyszko secured the toe hold on several occasions and while he failed to secure a fall with it, he caused Esson great pain.




