

TWO MENTIONED FOR SENATE VACANCIES

Sir Lomer Gouin and Hon. A. David in Line For Appointment

QUEBEC, Sept. 22.—In generally well-informed Liberal circles here, it is stated that Sir Lomer Gouin, former premier of the province and former minister of justice, will be one of the first prominent names from this province to enter the Senate to fill one of the two vacancies from the Montreal district, now existing through the death of Senator L. O. David and Senator

Thibault. It is also understood that Hon. Athanasius David, provincial secretary, will be given first choice for the succession to his father's seat, but that efforts are being made to retain him in provincial politics. Also, Donat Raymond is prominently mentioned as the second Montreal senator. It is stated also in the same circles that, most likely, Hon. V. Massey will become Lieutenant-Governor of Ontario, succeeding Hon. Mr. Cockshutt, whose term of office has expired.

FATALLY INJURED CHASING HIS DOG

Montreal Boy Runs in Path of Auto and Skull is Fractured

MONTREAL, Sept. 22.—Four-year-old Gerald Fournier, of 477 Grand Trunk street, died in St. Justine Hospital from a fractured skull and a broken shoulder, suffered when he was knocked down by an automobile. The accident occurred when, in trying to catch his dog, the boy ran in front of

the auto in Ropery street, near his home. The police were informed that the youngster was playing on the west side of the street with a group of boys. His dog was on the opposite side and he called to it but as it did not obey Fournier started across to catch it and crossed the path of an auto driven by L. A. Lamontagne, of 1083 Joseph avenue, Verdun, and was struck down.

Woodstock Rates Lower, Is Report

J. M. Trueman, chairman of the New Brunswick Public Utilities Board, said yesterday afternoon that notice had been received by the board that the schedule of rates for electric current in Woodstock would be filed at the special meeting on Friday, October 1. It is understood these rates are much lower than those now in effect.

WILL ENLARGE THE PORT OF SANTOS

Plans for enlargement of the Port of Santos are well under way. The present docks extend for 4,726 meters and have a minimum depth alongside of from seven to eight meters. The new project proposes the construction of 2,700 meters of additional dock space, 2,000 meters to have a 10-meter depth alongside and the other 700 to have seven meters depth. The new construction will cost approximately \$17,000,000.
