WOODSTOCK, Nov. 16-That householders would receive the benefit of a reduction approximating 20 per cent. in their light bills, as a result of new domestic lighting rates filed by the Woodstock Electric Railway Light and Power Company at the hearing today before the New Brunswick Utilities Commission, was the opin-Utilities Commission, was the opinion of M. The hearing, arising from an appeal made by the Woodstock Town Council against alleged excessive electric light and power rates being charged by the Woodstock Electric Railway, Light and Power Company, was held in the county court house before a fairly representative gathering of citizens.
