

—How rapidly fuel oil is ousting coal in ocean transport is revealed by the report of Lloyd's Register of Shipping for the year ended June, 1924, which shows the great increase in the use of oil fuel in ships.

In July, 1914, the gross tonnage of steamers fitted for burning oil fuel was 1,310,209. In July, 1923, the figures were 15,792,418, while at July, 1924, the tonnage had reached 17,154,072.


