MAN DIES IN \$300,000 BLAZE ON EAST RIVER; LAID TO STILL

Sounds Warning Of

Tremors, Says Seismo-

Fire Believed to Have Been Japanese Pheasant Caused by an Explosion.

New York, Aug. 17.—A man was burned to death and property worth 800,000 was destroyed in a fire, caused Bird Very Sensitive to Earth by an explosion, in a one-story storage warehouse in Long Island City on Tuesday. So dense was the smoke from

Tuesday. So dense was the smoke from the fire, which was the most spectacular blaze the East River waterfront has seen in years, that traffic over the Queensboro Bridge was halted for more than half an hour.

A fireman soaking the blaze after it was under control, discovered a fifty-gallon still, a quantity of five and ten gallon cans containing denatured alcohol. The fire is believed to have been caused by the explosion of a still similar to the one found.

Near the spot where the fire began was found the body of a man who is believed to be Daniel Pagliarello, a chauffeur. The body was charred beyond recognition. Underneath it was found a wallet which contained the half-burned chauffeur's card of Pagliarello and a bankbook.
