TIGHTEN STRINGS ON IMMIGRATION

Force of Inspectors on Border Between United States and Canada to be Increased to Prevent Entrance of Europeans.

Washington, June 21.—(By Canadian Press)—The United States Immigration service plans to increase its force of inspectors along the border between this country and Canada. It was stated by high officials of the service that this step would be taken. The reason for it grew out of the enactment of the new emergency immigration restriction law, which heavily curtails immigration from Europe and some other parts of the old world.

Enforcement of this law is putting a heavy burden on the immigration service. While the new law has almost nothing to do directly with immigration with Canada and imposes no restrictions on arrivals from the dominion additional to the old law, it is a fact that inasmuch as many thousands of persons in Europe who would like to enter the United States will be shut out from direct admission, there is a tendency to try to get in by indirect routes through Canada and Mexico. This tendency is already marked, in fact.

In the case of Mexico, by reason of the unsettled conditions and the lax enforcement of law, great numbers of persons from Europe are arriving there and seeking to cross into the United States secretly. Many have been apprehended and deported but the trouble has only begun. With respect to Canada, the new law makes provisions under which alien

from the countries covered by the law—no Canada because that country is not included in the restrictions—who have lived in Canada under one year and desire to enter the United States on their account of in making up the quotas from their respective nations. There will be no difficulty about this. The real difficulty will be that many immigrants, it is expected, will try to enter Canada with the object of ultimately finding their way into the United States. The immigration officials have already apprehended some persons who have tried this plan. However the difficulties are by no means as great as in dealing with Mexico for the reason that this country has inspectors at the Canadian ports such as Montreal and Quebec, and the reason Canada itself has strong immigration laws.

Nevertheless, increasing pressure on both the Canadian and Mexican borders to enter the United States is certain and more inspectors will be necessary to watch over the border if the attempt at restriction is to succeed.

The new law provides that immigration from any of the European countries and from Africa, Australasia and southwest Asia shall be limited to the number of residents to be set by the 1910 census. It has been in effect less than a month. It has caused great confusion and congestion at Ellis Island, New York and other leading immigration stations on the Atlantic coast for the reason that the steamship companies in some cases have brought over large numbers of immigrants in excess of the quotas allowed by law. Thousands of these people have been detained with the result that appeals to allow them to come in are flooding the immigration service. The House immigration committee has taken the subject up and some of its members have charged the steamship companies with intentionally ignoring the law and bringing over immigrants—or would-be immigrants—on what one Congressman described as "a gamble that they will be admitted." It is probable that this procedure, which has caused great suffering and confusion at Ellis Island and elsewhere, will soon be checked and the law soon set to running smoothly. Demands are going in Congress, in fact, to provide by laws for severe penalties against the steamship companies that bring over immigrants in numbers obviously in excess of the allowed quota.

There is a wide difference in the view here about the wisdom of the new restriction law. Not a few students of the proposition declare it is shortsighted and that it is going to result in certain Canada great numbers of desirable citizens, developing the Canadian northwest more rapidly and hurting the United States by shutting out people who would in time make good and industrious citizens.
