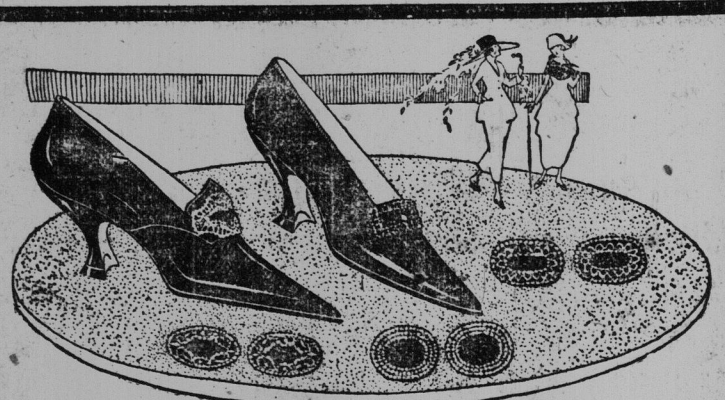

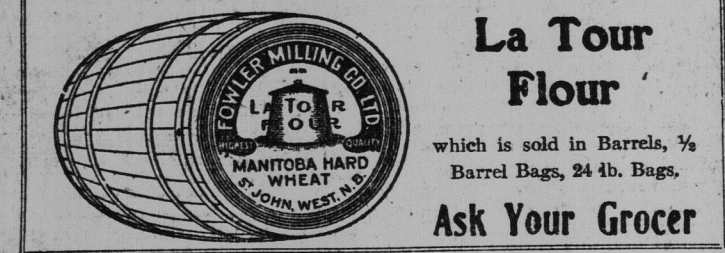

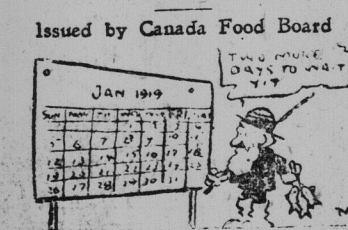

EVERY DAY FISH DAY.
The one-day-a-week nature of the fish business is one of the most serious deterrents to the increased consumption of fish. The fisherman's business is largely governed by wind and tide—conditions beyond his control. He must catch fish whenever he can and in the past he has frequently had to hold them for the popular day, even if it meant that some of them had to spoil. Cheaper and better fish are obtainable where dealer and consumer co-operate to make every day a fish day.

THRIFT RECIPES

CORN AND CHEESE.
Two cups corn.
One cup celery.
One cup buttered crumbs.
One teaspoon salt.
Two tablespoons fat.
Half cup hot milk.
Arrange corn and celery in layers with salt. Add hot milk and melted fat. Cover with buttered crumbs and bake twenty minutes.

Food Board Flashes

Never make the mistake of thinking that milk at fourteen cents a quart is expensive food. As a matter of fact you get more food value from milk at that price than from any other commodity. A quart of milk a day is a good allowance for a child. If he will not take it as a straight drink, give it to him in the form of sauces, milk puddings or soups. There is no substitute for milk in the child's diet.
