Position of Detroit Tigers Causes Dissatisfaction

What's got into the Detroit Tigers? It is what many fans are talking out, and when the smoke clears away, it is possible that Hughy Jennings may be jarred loose from the throne which has occupied so long.

He principal reason for complaint against the red-headed manager is the relative work of George Burns and Leo Dessen, first basemen. Burns was released to Philadelphia on the grounds that he couldn't hit. Burns claimed last spring that Jennings had never given him a fair chance.

Today Burns is one of the leading hitters in the league, hitting around .300. His successor, Dessen, is down at .188 and may fall even lower as the pitching improves.
