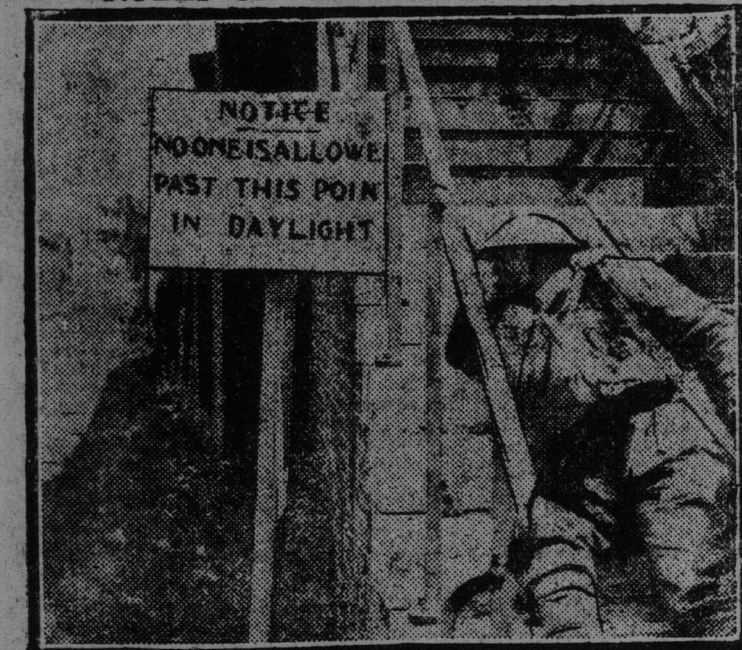

Miss Julia Hall.

Miss Julia Hall, younger daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Albert Hall of Penobscot, died at her home last evening. She had been ill about a month with typhoid fever and in spite of best nursing and medical care the illness terminated fatally. Besides her parents, two brothers and two sisters survive.

Rev. Allan Pollok, D.D.

Halifax, July 8.—The Herald records, with profound sorrow this morning, the death of the Rev. Allan Pollok, D.D., minister of the Presbyterian Church, Pine Hill, and for forty-three years associated with its life, as Professor of Church History and, successively thereafter as principal and honorary principal. Within the college circle, where he was regarded as a very "Father in God" the sadness in this forthright cannot be expressed in words. Dr. Pollok would have been eighty-nine years old next October—he came to Halifax from his native Scotland in 1832. In short, of his eighty-eight years of fruitful and brilliant life, sixty-six were spent in Nova Scotia. His companions on the voyage out were the late Dr. G. W. Spry and the late Dr. Alexander McLean. He came to the pastorate of St. Andrew's church, New Glasgow, which he held for twenty-two years, being rewarded for a most able and faithful ministry by the entire devotion of the people.

Yarmouth, N. S., July 8.—Mrs. Almina R. Perry, widow of Minard R. Perry, died recently at her residence, 14-16-18 Charlotte street, at the age of sixty-eight years. Mrs. Perry had been in poor health for several months, and early in the winter she went to Boston for medical advice, eventually undergoing two severe operations. She returned home last April, and despite everything that could be done for her, she passed away. She is survived by one son, Prof. D. Gordon Perry, of Quebec, three brothers and two sisters.

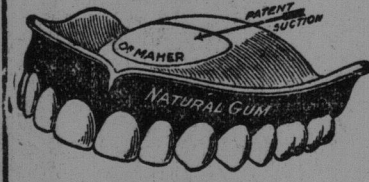
