FIRST EDITION. PARLIAMENT.

IT IS OPENED AT 5 O'CLOCK TODAY. The speech from the Throne was read by the Governor-General.

OTAWA, Ont., Jan. 31.—Today at 5 o'clock His Excellency the Governor-General proceeded to the Parliament House, and the members of the House of Commons having been summoned to the Chamber of the Senate, His Excellency was pleased to open the third session of the sixth Parliament of the Dominion of Canada with the following speech:

Honorable gentlemen of the Senate—gentlemen of the House of Commons—in addressing the Parliament of Canada for the first time in fulfillment of the solemn duty which has been committed to me as one of His Majesty's representatives—I desire to express the satisfaction with which I receive to your advice and assistance.

A measure will again be submitted to you to amend the laws relating to the electrical franchise, for the purpose of simplifying the law and lessening the cost of its operation.

During the year, my government has carefully considered the subject of consular service, and for the establishment in concert with Her Majesty's government, of a line of fast steamers between British Columbia and China and Japan.

A bill will be submitted for your consideration for the prevention of certain offences in connection with municipal councils, and to give greater facilities for making inquiries as to such matters.

Honorable gentlemen of the Senate, gentlemen of the House of Commons, I trust that the result of your deliberations may come under the divine blessing and promote the well being and prosperity of Canada.
