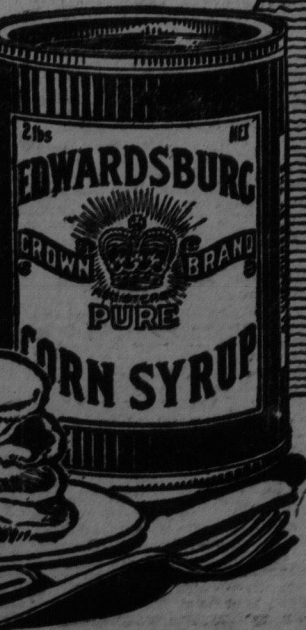

Large Audience At St. David's Church

Masterly Sermon by Rev. J. A. Clark, D. D. Was Preached Last Evening—German Street Choir Assisted in the Music.

The new St. David's church was filled with an audience last evening that listened with deep interest to a masterly sermon preached by Rev. J. A. Clark, D. D. The preliminary exercises were conducted by Rev. J. A. MacKinnon, the pastor of the church and the choir of German street Baptist church assisted in the music.

Dr. Clark's opening sermon was clearly an introduction to a series of sermons which he will preach during the week.

Dr. Clark's subject last evening was the story of regeneration, and before commencing his text, he said that his address during the week would be the old message which he hoped would appeal to open the minds and tender hearts.

He chose for his text St. John 3:19—"And this is the condemnation, that light has come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil."

After a brief reference to the actual meaning of the word condemnation, which he said was terrifying and terrible, he referred to the natural disposition to the human mind to live in the shadow and darkness, illustrating that the people would know that slavery was wrong but they would advocate slavery. People know drunkenness is wrong but they will permit drunkenness and will yield to their passionate desires. People will take undue advantage of each other and know that they should not do so. People will utter falsehoods but don't want to be regarded as liars, but they will lie.

One of the darkest forms of evil passions was selfishness, yet selfish people, particularly women will do things and persuade people they are not selfish, and we ask the question: Why do people do these things? Why do they prefer darkness to light? simply because they fear exposure.

Reminding his audience that this was not a bright picture, Dr. Clark said that he wanted them to clearly understand that condemnation is simply refusing to turn to the light, and light is a person. If a man wishes to be enlightened he goes to the best person to enlighten him, and the greatest light that comes to the human mind is the light of the gospel of Jesus Christ, and why do people not come, simply because they must pass through the process of heart searching and turn to that which they formerly indulged in, darkness.

Continuing Dr. Clark said: "You are simply asked to stop and turn away from evil habits and to serve God in sincerity and truth as revealed through Jesus Christ." All must suffer and repent as they turn from darkness to light before they will be well. Our Lord is the great physician, Saviour and Healer. Dr. Clark's sermon was a clear and serious exposition of the text chosen, closing as follows: "There is therefore no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus, no light like that coming to Jesus."

After the service the choir sang that appropriate hymn "Lead Kindly Light" and the service was brought to a close with the pronouncing of the benediction.

THE ASSAULT STILL AT LARGE

Detective Power Secures Revolver Used in Shooting Policeman Stinson—Bullet Located by X-Ray Yesterday.

No arrests have yet been made, following the assault on William Stinson, Fairville police officer, who was shot in the left arm, Sunday night. Detective Sgt. John Power has secured the weapon used, an old-fashioned 22-calibre Ivers Johnson revolver, and a good clue has been obtained as to the identity of the two men mixed up in the case. William Stinson, the injured man, was taken to the St. John infirmary yesterday and an X-ray examination made of the wound, the bullet being found near the shoulder blade. He is now at his home and was reported last night to be resting comfortably.

"Carried On" With Red Shield Folks

Interesting Lecture Given Last Evening in Salvation Army Citadel by Lieut. Colonel Charles Taylor—Eighteen Months' Experience Told.

What was later classed as one of the most interesting lectures ever given before a St. John audience was delivered last night in the Salvation Army Citadel, Charlotte street, by Lieut.-Colonel Charles Taylor, before a large and representative audience.

Col. Taylor, who for some nine years was principal of the Salvation Army Training College in Toronto, and who for a considerable time "carried on" with the Red Shield folks at the front during the world war, told his hearers something of what the Army has done in helping the Canadian and British troops during the critical days in the war.

His experience covered an eighteen months' activity in the aerial raiding districts of France, and his first-hand stories of what the boys suffered, and how they cheered each other and themselves to do their noble task alternately evoked tears and laughter from his spell-bound listeners. Col. Taylor is a natural born orator and by his record last night alone is sure of a large audience in St. John whenever he elects to speak here again.

Rounding out the excellent programme were several solos by Commandant Sheard, and short talks by Mrs. (Brigadier) Moore and Adjutant Clarke.

Col. Taylor left last night for Halifax, but is expected back in the city the latter part of this week at present he is engaged in the Salvation Army's immigration work.

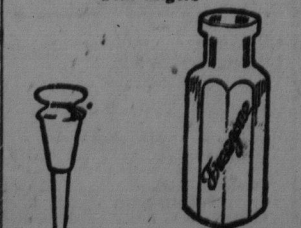

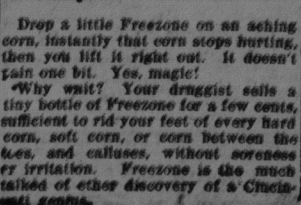

NEW MINISTRY IN NEWFOUNDLAND SWORN IN MONDAY

The Next Meeting of the Legislature Will Suppress the Ministry of Militia, Created for the War.

St. John's, Nfld., Nov. 17.—A new ministry was sworn in today, headed by Richard Squires as Premier and Colonial Secretary. Mr. Squires is leader of the forces which successfully opposed the government party in the recent elections for the Newfoundland legislature. His chief ally, Wm. Conker, head of the Fishermen Union, which represents the largest laboring element in the colony, was made minister of marine and fisheries. The other members of the cabinet are William Warren, minister of justice; Henry Brownrigg, minister of finance; Walter Hallyard, Arthur Barnes, George Shea, Alexander Campbell and Samuel Foote, ministers without portfolio.

New holders of portfolios outside the cabinet are William Jennings, public works and William Cline, shipping. The portfolio of agriculture is still vacant.

It is understood that at the next session of the legislature new ministers of post office and education will be created to be filled by two of the present ministers without portfolio, and that the ministry for militia, created for the war, will be suppressed.

MINISTER ROLLO TO PERSONALLY ACT IN LABOR DISPUTES

Will Endeavor to Get Right Into the Troubles Himself and Endeavor to Effect Adjustments.

Toronto, Ont., Nov. 17.—Hon. W. R. Rollo, Minister of Health and Labor, assumed the direction of his department in the Parliament Buildings today. With reference to his proposed plan of operations, Mr. Rollo said:

"What I purpose doing, in so far as it will be found practicable, will be to give my own personal attention to any questions of labor disputes that may arise. I do not believe that this work should be delegated to clerks or perfunctorily dealt with in letters promising 'consideration.' I shall endeavor to get right into the trouble myself and see what I can do personally at all times to effect adjustments."

DIDN'T OBJECT AND LOST JOB

Mexican Consul at El Paso Failed to Take Exception to Remarks of Texas Governor.

Laredo, Texas, Nov. 17.—Andre Garcia, Mexican Consul at El Paso, has been dismissed by the Carranza Government, according to Mexico City advices received here today, because "he remained calmly seated" at a recent banquet in El Paso when Governor W. P. Hobby, of Texas, urged intervention in Mexico.

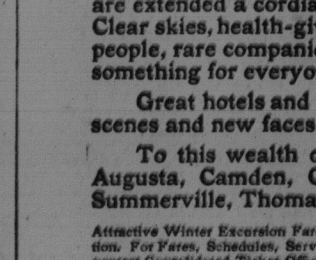

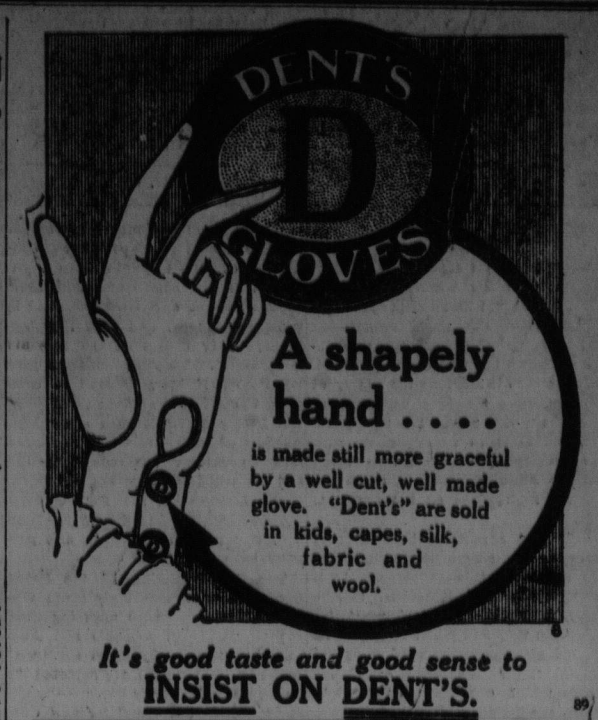
