POISON PLACED IN SODA WATER

Cause Sudden Deaths of Ship's Surgeon and Passenger on the Moana.

San Francisco, Cal., Feb. 25.—Poison placed in bottles of soda water caused the deaths at sea on January 8 of Dr. John Grimm surgeon of the Union Steamship Company's liner Moana, and Miss Nellie Iabister, formerly of Berkeley, Cal., while the steamer was en route from San Francisco to Wellington, N. Z. It was learned here today when the Moana arrived from the Antipodes, Capt. Barlow, master of the steamer, said that the Wellington military authorities were investigating a suspected conspiracy which they believed was directed at the wholesale poisoning of troops aboard British transports and that arrests were expected. A civilian inquest exonerated every person aboard the Moana. Captain Barlow said. The bodies of Dr. Grimm and Miss Iabister were buried at sea.

CANADA WILL DO AS U. S. DOES

Their Action Regarding Daylight Savings Will Mark Canada's Course in the Matter.

Ottawa, Ont., Feb. 25.—Continuation of daylight saving in Canada will depend on the stand taken by the United States Congress. If Congress decides to repeal its daylight savings measure, it is felt here that merely confusion would be created by putting Canadian clocks forward an hour during the summer months.

Barkentine Westfield.
The Australian barkentine Westfield which brought a large cargo of grain and flour to this port several months ago is now ready for sea, and will probably sail today, stopping at African ports on her way home to Melbourne. She carries a full general cargo, including a quantity of lumber. Captain Weymouth is her new commander.

Here From West Indies.
The S. S. Norfolk is unloading 15,000 bags of raw sugar at the refinery wharf, and the Philadelphia is also discharging her cargo of 8,000 bags at the same docks. Both these vessels are from La Romana, British West Indies. The R. M. S. P. Carara, in due time tomorrow night with mails, passengers, and a large general cargo, including sugar, from Barbadoes.

PROTEST AGAINST SINKING SHIPS
Rome, Feb. 25.—A protest against the proposal to sink surrendered German warships is printed by the Tribuna today. The newspaper urges the distribution of the warships proportionately among the Allies.

LAND SAFELY FROM FLOATING ICE PACK
New York, Feb. 25.—Advices received from the Arctic expedition and a party of five explorers who boarded a floating ice pack in the Polar basin last May in an effort to reach across the North Pole had landed safely November seventh. No details were given.

ALBERT
Albert, N. B., Feb. 24.—The Shepley rivet is again clear of ice and navigation is completely open. The fleet of schooners along the shores are being repaired, and made ready for the season's traffic, while the fleet of lighters are being overhauled and made ready for their share of the work. Some will be used for lightering lumber, and others will be used to carry gravel from Albert and Mary's Point to Moncton City.

The residents of the large section of this county through which the Albert Railway runs, are much pleased with the greatly improved service of this railway since it was taken over by the government.

There are some small matters which would be of very small extra cost to the present management, and yet would be found to be very convenient by the users of the line. One of these is the matter of a telephone in the small temporary railway station of Albert and express room at Albert, a small building brought down the line several months ago on a flat car, and being used until a permanent structure fitting for a railway terminus like Albert is supplied, to replace the building destroyed by fire upwards of a year ago.

There is no telephone communication with the offices in this station, although the wire hangs actually touching the building. It may be that the C.N.R. management does not know of this defect in the service, possibly due to the fact that the building was taken to Westfield yesterday morning on the C. P. R. for burial.
