

Owner of Great London Store Foresees Big Change in Market Conditions.

DOES NOT LOOK FOR ANY PANIC Mr. Selfridge Thinks How-

ever That Decline in World

Prices Will Alter Things.

High Price Return Unreasonable.

"I look for a general decline in most classes of merchandise and see no reason why those lower prices should later be stiffened. It must be recognized however, that wages and salaries of workers in mills, factories and workrooms have been so greatly increased that anything approaching the prices of four or five years ago will be entirely out of the quostion as long as wages remain as they are now. The fact is often neglected, in thinking of costs of merchandise, that a very large part of costs is money paid for labor."

Answering a question as to whether there is any reason for being apprehensive of a panic, Mr. Selfridge said he saw none whatever.

"Great Britain," he said, "is not inclined toward panics, and her people do not rush very wildly in either direction. Her financial actions are not unlike the weather, which here never gets very cold and never gets very hot."
