London, Jan. 3.—The government issued as a "white paper" this afternoon the text of what appeared to be the draft of a proposed treaty betyeen the Republic of Ireland," which the Republic of Ireland," which the government states was captured in Dublin.

A covering letter, it was stated, captured at the same time signed "Dermot O'Hegarty", described in the white paper as one of the Irish republican parliaments secretaries, addressed to Desmond Fitsgereld, Sinn Fein minister of propaganda. This letter is dated June 16, 1920.

The preamble of the alleged treaty is quoted as saying:

"Desirous of promoting peaceful and friendly relations between all nations, especially the peoples of Ireland and Russia, and striving to co-operate in the interest and advancement of the human race and for the iberation of all people from imperialistic exploitation and oppression, the governments of the Russian Socialist Federal Soviet republic and the Republic of Ireland agree as follows:

Both parties declare in favor of universal disarmament and the formation of some kind of a league of neations for compulsory arbitration of international disputes. The duration of the treaty proposed in the document is a period of ten years.
