F. Augustus Heinze Retires from Presidency of Mercantile Bank



This action Gross & Kleeberg stated, was responsible for their failure. Attorneys for this firm stated today that the amount owing to the firm by the Heinze firm aggregated \$600,000.

The Heinze firm announced that it is perfectly solvent and that all its legal obligations will be met.

The resignation of F. Augustus Heinze from the presidency of the Mercantile National Bank, it is said, was decided on at a midnight meeting at the house of C.
