From Fredericton.

(Special Telegram to the Daily Tribune.) FREDERICTON, March 9. No mail from any railway point received here since Tuesday morning. A party of blockaded people walked on the railway track some distance, and report the snow packed in as hard as ice. The train from St. John connected with the Fredericton train at two o'clock this morning, and left the Junction for Fred-
