

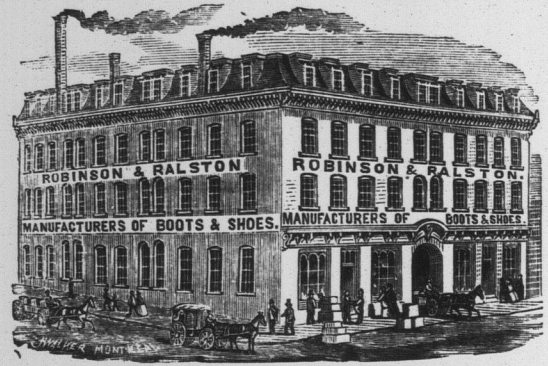

THE LEGISLATURE.

(Special Telegram to the Daily Tribune.)

SATURDAY'S PROCEEDINGS.

FREDERICTON, March 9. The Bill to enable the York County Council to aid in paying off the debt of the Fredericton Branch Railroad was agreed to. Crawford introduced a bill to amend the Act to remove the Shiretown of King's County. Robinson's bill to give power to Commissioners to be appointed by Governor-in-Council to expend money raised by tax on wild lands, was agreed to, with an amendment by Woodburn that the Commissioners give bonds. At 12:30 Crawford rose to defend the Government policy. He said there were no charges made to defend, but he must say something in reply to slanders hurled at the Government. He said the three hours' speech of Willis was a miserable failure, and the Opposition were responsible for the expense to the country. The School Bill worked as satisfactorily as could be expected, and the appointment of a Superintendent was a good one. He said better terms and other delegations were required. Hibbard and Gough could not take the leadership of the Opposition, and taking up Willis was a blind.

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

In the Legislative Council, the House went into committee on the New Brunswick Masonic Hall Company, and amended a bill by limiting property to be held by the Company to two hundred thousand dollars.

From Fredericton.

(Special Telegram to the Daily Tribune.)

FREDERICTON, March 9.

No mail from any railway point received here since Tuesday morning. A party of blockaded people walked on the railway track some distance, and report the snow packed in as hard as ice. The train from St. John connected with the Fredericton train at two o'clock this morning, and left the station for Fredericton at 8:30 o'clock. Will probably reach here to-night. Montgomery and Theriault arrived yet. The concert in aid of the Baptist Organ Fund was attended by a very large audience. Mrs. Perley was the attraction, and will sing again this month in aid of the Volunteer Band.

From Ottawa.

(Special to the Tribune.)

OTTAWA, March 9.

Information has been received by the Marine Department that the Ottoman Government have made free the passage of the Dardanelles and Bosphorus since 30th December last. A notice to Shipmasters, in accordance therewith, has been issued. Warrants are issued for the election of Water Commissioners, one for each ward, the work of construction to be commenced shortly. Alderman Featherstone resigned his seat in Council to run for Commissioner. At his resignation he replied as length to Howe's strictures on the Council. Donald Smith, M. P., is here. Costigan has left.

British and Foreign.

(To the St. John Associated Press.)

LONDON, March 9.

Payment of two millions of war indemnity with interest to date on remaining three millions, completed yesterday. This gives France entire control of six departments, in which she is allowed to maintain as large a military force as she desires. Assembly of day rejected the proposition of Deputy Brunet to erect on the hill of Trocadero a Temple to Jesus Christ, as testimony to a belief in God as necessary for the national regeneration. Emperor and Empress of Brazil arrived in Lisbon, whence they sail the 13th inst. for Rio Janeiro. Von Moltke is making a tour of Italy and is now at Naples. Prussian Government claims to have discovered secret appointment by the Pope of Archbishop Posen as Primate of Poland. Upper House of German Diet passed a bill for Government Supervisor of Schools.

Valuable Cargo of Lumber.

One of the largest and most valuable cargoes of lumber that has ever been shipped from this port, its value being estimated at \$21,000, is that of the ship "Cambria," which cleared to day for Valparaiso. She carries 700,000 superficial feet of pine boards and plank. The cargo is purchased by a New York house from E. D. Jewett & Co., of this City. The "Cambria" is owned by Messrs. Richards & Son, Barch's Hotel. The paining of this popular Hotel has been thoroughly renovated, and now presents a very fine appearance.
