

early March is the best time for this operation, and once performed the graft may be left to look after itself, no further care or attention peing needful In about 12 months the radicle will have taken a firm hold, and the green leaves will begin to show themselves.

As regards the choice of the tree, this matters little within certain limits. There are in England about 20 species of trees capable of producing mistletoe, including such commor ones as the apple, pear, ash, lime willow, almond, fir and oak. But care should be taken not to select. for the experiment a too valuable tree. For the mistletoe is a parasite, and lives by sucking up the juices of the tree to which it is attached. The mistletoe plant, if left to its own devices. will not infrequently kill the tree which nourishes it, thereby itself committing suicide. Tit Bits.
