REGIMENTAL.

Acting upon the instructions contained in the last General Orders, the enrolment of members of the new kilted corps in Toronto has been commenced. St. Andrew's Hall is, for the time being, regimental headquarters. The *Empire* report says : "Lieut.-Col. Otter, D.A.G., and Lieut.-Col. Gray, brigade major, were there and very busy enrolling men. Lieut.-Col. Gray took the names of the men, and Lieut.-Col. Otter swore them in, by half dozen batches, on a Gaelic Bible, which had been procured for the occasion. Before beginning the swearing in process, Lieut.-Col. Otter explained to the men the oath which they took, and asked them to do their duty in the regiment readily and faithfully at all times. He told the men that he had received a general order from Ottawa to detail an officer from C Company, I.S.C., to assist the commanding officer until the officers had all been gazetted, and the regiment was in good working order. On the strength of this order, Capt. Macdougall was appointed to act as Adjutant of the Queen's Highlanders for the time being. There were about 180 men sworn in, who were as fine looking men as one will find in any regiment of volunteers in Canada. The coming commanding officer, Mr. J. I. Davidson, was as busy as a bee, and as proud as a major general. Bugle-Major Swift, of the Q.O.R., presented the regiment with a regimental bugle call of his own composition and arrangement. He sounded it a few times, so they could know when they were called in future."


