

CRAIG, THOMAS DIXON (*Durham East*).

B. in London, Eng., 20 Nov., 1842, and came to Can. when six months old. Ed. at Toronto Univ., where he graduated in 1864. Was Gold Medalist in metaphysics. Sat in Leg. Assem., Ont., from 1886 to 1890. Introduced the motion respecting French Schools in Ontario, which caused the Mowat Govt. to appoint a commission on the subject, and which was one of the principal planks in the platform of the Conservative party at the g. e., 1890, for the Ontario Legislature. First returned to the Commons, g. e., 1891 and re-elected, 1896. A Conservative.—*Port Hope, Ont.*

DAVIES, Hon. LOUIS HENRY, Q.C., P.C. (*Queen's, P.E.I.*).

S. of Hon. Benjamin Davies, M.P.P., and grands. of Nathan Davies, Esq., who came to P.E.I., about 1812. B. in Charlottetown, P.E.I., 4 May, 1845. Ed. at the Central Academy, and Prince of Wales Coll. M., at St. Eleanors, P.E.I., July, 1872, Susan, fourth dau. of the late Dr. A. V. G. Wiggins. Called to the Bar, P.E.I., 1866, and apptd. a Q.C., 26 Nov., 1880. Is Presdnt. of the Merchant's Bank of P.E.I. Was Counsel for the Tenantry before the P.E.I. Land Commission, presided over by the Right Hon. H. C. Childers, and was one of the Canadian Counsel before the International Fishery Commission, at Halifax 1877. Was Solicitor General of P.E.I. in 1869, and again in 1872-73, and Leader of the Opposition in the Leg. Assem., until Sept., 1876, when he became Premier and Attorney-General. His Administration resigned March, 1879. Sat in Leg. Assem., P.E.I., from Nov., 1872, until g. e., 1879, when he was defeated. First returned to Commons at g. e., 1882, and re-elected at g. e., 1887, 1891 and 1896. Sworn of the Privy Council, and apptd. Minister of Marine and Fisheries. 13 July, 1896. Re-elected by acclamation on acceptance of office. A Liberal.—*Riverside, Charlottetown, P.E.I.* ; *Rideau Club, Ottawa.*

DAVIN, NICHOLAS FLOOD, Q.C. (*Assiniboia West*).

Descended from an Irish family settled in Tipperary for some generations. B. at Kilfinane, 13 Jan., 1843. Ed. at the Common School, by private tuition, at a Coll. affiliated to London Univ., and afterwards at Queen's Coll., Cork. Called to the English Bar by the Hon. Soc. of the Middle Temple, Hilary Term,
