The percentages in this table are subject to the same variations, from the same causes, as those affecting table No. 7, but as the same amounts of duty, as shown in the former table, are the dividends, while the divisors are smaller, the quotient must, of necessity, show a higher percentage. In other words, the amount of duty is the same in each table, while the values are less in the latter than in the former.
