

tion or other stores for their use, and all Policemen, Constables, and others travelling on Her Majesty's Service, on their Rail-road or Railway; and shall, on being thereunto required as aforesaid, place any Electric Telegraph erected by them, or belonging to them, at the disposal of Her Majesty's Government, or of any such Officer as aforesaid;—and all such services shall be performed on such terms and conditions, and under such regulations as the Company and the Deputy Post-Master General, the Commander of the Forces, or the person in command of any Police Force, respectively shall agree upon, or if they cannot agree then upon such terms and conditions, and under such regulations as the Governor or person administering the Government shall in Council make;—and so much of any such Act as aforesaid as provides that such Company shall not, in performing any of the services aforesaid, be required to start any Train or Steam-boat at any other time than their ordinary time of starting the same, shall be, and is hereby repealed.

Certain By-Laws of Rail-road Companies not to be valid unless confirmed by the Governor in Council.

II. And be it enacted, That for and notwithstanding any thing to the contrary in the Act incorporating any such Company as aforesaid, or in any Act amending such Act, no By-Law of such Company by which any Tolls shall be imposed or altered, or by which any party other than the Members, Servants, and Officers of the Company are intended to be bound, shall have any force or effect until the same shall have been approved and sanctioned by the Governor in Council.
