students over a beer in Fridays and ratt. This, they said, is where most of the intellectualizing on campus takes place, and it is here we made much of our progress in promoting the communism of West Germany."

Students of the two, when questioned, expressed shock and indignation at the news that their profs are spys and crib cheaters. "They were greatly respected by all their students," said one, who wished to remain unidentified, "and there is some talk about starting a petition to have them reinstated in their positions."

Dr. Kolchak, chairman of the department, was unavailable for comment following the revelation. Dr. Kolchak was suddenly called away and it is not known when he will return.

Before being taken into protective custody, Prof. Kangienos was able to hint that many influential people in education, politics, "will be greatly alarmed by our willingness to talk."

There was no mention of setting up split-shifts for those students who couldn't accommodate the normal shifts.

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
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
