Uplands, Ontario	November 13th 1943		Overcast, snow showers. Officers from No. 12 Recruiting Centre, Ottawa, brought 45 High School students, prospective Air Force recruits, to the Station and were conducted on a tour by our Officers and N.C.O.'s. "The Falcon's Brother" was the movie shown in the Recreation Hall to a large gathering. R163307, LAC Stewart, J.H., piloting Harvard 3025, pulled out from side of runway on main aerodrome and collided with Harvard 2885 which was piloted by R198414, LAC Cooper, L.D. Category of 3025 "C"; category of 2885 "D-2". No injury to either pilot.	
	November 14th 1943		Partly cloudy. Regular Church services held in the morning in the Recreation Hall. Flight Lieutenant Anderson of No. 3 Training Command officiated at the Protestant service in the absence of Flight Lieutenant Perkins. The movie "Corvette K-225" was shown to a capacity audience in the Recreation Hall in the evening.	
	November 15th 1943		Partly cloudy. Glee Club rehearsal and music hour well attended in Recreation Hall.	
	November 16th 1943		Partly cloudy, snow showers. Group Captain Raymond was promoted to the rank of Acting Air Commodore effective today. "Corvette K-225" starring Randolph Scott was again shown. Duke Ellington, famous American Band leader, entertained a capacity audience for about an hour in the Recreation Hall. The Commanding Officer entertained the Junior Flying Instructors and Training Wing Staff at dinner at the Chateau Laurier.	
	November 17th 1943		Cloudy to overcast. Snow showers. Music appreciation hour well attended. R190679 LAC Davidson, W.C., nosed up Harvard 2778 at main aerodrome while night flying. Categorized as "D-1". No injury to pilot.
