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it is dependant on rent interest and wages, being the residue which remains over and above the satisfaction of these prior claims. A fifth claimant has been introduced by some under the name of the anomalous recipient. Some seeking a more definite name have termed it the Government share founded its share, which they ~~find~~ ^{see} in taxation, on the peace and good order, which ~~it~~ ^{government} preserves enabling production to be satisfactorily carried on. It is certainly questionable whether such a position can be maintained, ~~and~~ even admitting the service of government and ^{regarding} ~~taxat-~~ ion as a payment for that service, it remains still to be shown that that payment when made is not in fact derivative, that it is not paid out of the respective shares which other recognized claimants receive. ~~whether~~ ^{where} in cases of monopoly excessive gains are realized there ~~may possibly be~~ a theoretical recipient of monopolistic gains; in fact ~~the~~ ^{this recipient} has not as yet been distinguished from the capitalist, or manager of the business. Whether a certain school of economic writers will eventually succeed in ~~giving~~ ^{granting} for "society" this position in practice which they maintain it already holds in theory, though ^{even there} ~~not~~ always so recognized, remains ~~a fact~~ ^{to be seen}, it is one of the most "unsettled problems."

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
