I have your letter in connection with the Seaway Brief which I prepared and I will be glad indeed to make the alterations in it along the lines you suggest.

I am sending a copy of the Brief to Mr. Hanson. I did not discuss the matter with him when he was here as he was with Casselman all the time and for various reasons I think Casselman is favourable to the project. I left a copy with Howard Green. Green is opposed to the Seaway, but he does not see how he can oppose it since Roosevelt wants it. I think I did something to waken him up in this regard, but some others may have to do likewise. Diefenbaker I have not seen as he has been in Ottawa on that Special Committee on war purchases. I sent a copy to John Haig and have a reply from him. He will certainly do anything he can in the matter.
