



Ottawa, 14th October, 1910.

Sir,

In connection with your report dated 30th September of work at your Agency during that month, I beg to direct your attention to correspondence (file 163314) relating to the fields at your Agency infested with wild oats. The Department wishes to know what action you have taken towards exterminating this weed since the somewhat lengthy correspondence had with you on the subject. You should also state whether there is any danger of the spread of the oats owing to the present condition of the fields. The matter should not be overlooked and any action which you can take this Fall towards the extermination **of the weed** should not be neglected. A special report in this connection is desired from you. I may remind you that the Department allowed you to carry out to a large extent your own suggestions in this matter and, therefore, you will be held responsible for the results obtained. **The Department also desires to be informed what state the summer fallowing and breaking are in at the present time. Has the latter been disked, etc ?**
