
Sir:-

I have to refer to communication addressed you on July 10th last respecting instalments due on the W.1/2 Sec. 11, Tp. 20, Rge. 21, W-4-M, and as payment was not made I am again acquainting you with the fact that the Department urgently requires the money for the purpose of carrying out its obligations incurred with the Indians when surrender of the lands for disposal was taken.

As this cannot be accomplished without the purchasers complying with the conditions of the sale, by forwarding the due instalments, it is expected that you will transmit the sum of \$1,760.00, being composed of \$1,280.00 principal and \$480.00 interest, which is computed to the 14th instant.

Failure to comply, will be met by the Department considering the question of cancellation of the sales, forfeiture of moneys paid and redispotion of the land.
