Q.72. Oh you meen pay from the mine?

A.72. Yes.

Q.73. And when would you presumably be getting your next pay?

A.73. I would get my pay the next Saturday,

THE DEFENDING OFFICER DECLINES TO RE-EXAMINE.

QUESTIONED BY THE COURT

Q.74. When did you go to work in the mines?

A.74. I went to work just about three days after I went home sir, after I left the Depot.

Q.75. Did you work every day?

A.75. Every day but one shift sir.

Q.76. How is it that these papers are made out on the 13th March, 1944, the day you were apprehended? (Referring to the documents shown to the Court by the accused relative to his work in the mine).

A.76. Well sir I was working in No. 2 mine before sir.

Q.77. Now you have an identity card issued again on the 13th March - did you not have an identity card before?

A.77. No sir, I 'ust had my cards from the woods sir - my registration card sir.

Q.78. I cannot understand if you were working continuously why were you issued with a new set of papers?

A.78. I was working in No. 2 mine and I went up and got my transfer to No. 4 and I had to take out new papers.

Q.79. You had to take out a new set of papers?

A.79. Yes sir. That is the day I lost my days work - the day I was transferred.

IN THE OPINION OF THE COURT IT IS NOT NECESSARY TO COMPLY NITH H.P. 83 (B).
